It will also be held as part of the 200th anniversary celebrations of St Andrew's Cathedral, and will be led by Cathedral Administrator, Monsignor Chris McElroy. The pilgrimage will allow visits to all the great sights of Christendom, including Bethlehem, Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee and Jerusalem.
