His second challenge is even greater: everyone should make provision for the marginalized in society—the poor, crippled, lame and blind—as a priority, and not issue invitations to the influential or to family in the hope of being invited in return.*

Following the devastating earthquake which struck central Italy, Archbishop Tartaglia will offer a special "Mass for Italy" on Monday August 29 at 1pm in St Andrew's Cathedral. All are welcome to attend to show solidarity with those who have been affected.

In addition the Archbishop has written to the Bishops of Ascoli Piceno and Rieti (the dioceses of the territory) to express the support and sympathy of the people of Glasgow and beyond to all those affected by the earthquakes.

A special collection will be taken up at Monday's Mass to assist the survivors of the earthquake and will be sent directly to the two dioceses concerned.

### Refugee Aid Appeal

Collection for Refugees on the Greek Island of Samos. Looking for toiletries: Nappies (Size 3 upwards), baby wipes, nappy cream, soap bars, hair combs, hand sanitiser, sun cream (SPF 30+), tissues, body lotion, face cloths and towels. Clothes/shoes for: children, teenagers, men and women. Men's clothes are required urgently (S/M). As most of the refugees are Muslim, the clothing required for woman needs to be modest. Clothes need to be in good condition; no stains or rips. Baby strollers are also required. Please leave any donations at the back of the church after Mass on the following weekends 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> September.
