Gospel Luke 15: 1-32

There will be rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner.



Luke often indicates why Jesus told parables. Today's are about loss—of a sheep, a coin and a son. Jesus told these because the Pharisees and scribes were complaining that tax collectors and sinners were wanting to listen to Jesus, and Jesus allowed them! These parables indicate the joy of recovering what was lost (sheep, coin, son), but the final parable ends on a sad note: the elder son here refuses to be found!
