You broke with idolatry and became servants of God; you are now waiting for his Son.

Gospel Matthew 22:34-40

You must love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

A question to Jesus: which commandment is the greatest? This was much debated, not in a search for a single commandment more important than any other—all commandments were considered equally important—but rather in the sense of one commandment that summed up the whole Law. Jesus' answer uses two existing commandments. Together, love of God with every fibre of your being, and love neighbour as self: everything in the Law is contained in those precepts.
